

ELECTION PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS, it is by the 13th section of the Act of July 9, 1842, entitled "An Act to regulate the elections for the Commonwealth," it is enjoined on the Sheriff of every County to give notice of such elections to be held and enumerated in such notice what officers are to be elected. In virtue whereof, JOSEPH MORSE, High Sheriff of the County of McKean, doth therefore, make known and give this public notice in the election of said County of McKean, that a General Election will be held in the said County on Tues day next after the first Monday of November, being the 6th day of November, 1860, at the time and place appointed by the President and Vice-President of the United States to be elected.

All the qualified electors of said County of McKean, shall have a right to vote in the several districts, as follows:

The Borough of Smethport, at the Court House in
