sworn, doth depose and say that he is a practical
Druggist and Chemist. That some time in the latter part of May, or first of June, 1848, a man by the name of Jacob Townsend, who at that time was a book and pamphlet peddler, called upon deponent, at the house of Mr. Thompson, No. 42 Hudson-street, where deponent hoarded, and requested deponent to write him a recipe by which to make a Syrup of Sarsaparilla. Deponent further says, that he became acquainted with said Townsend at the office of Theodore Foster, Esq., Book Publisher, with whom said Townsend deatt. That said Townsend had had frequent conversations with depopent respecting the manufacture of an article of Sarsaparilla to be sold under the name of Dr.

That said Townsend stated he was an old man, and poor, and was not fit for hard labor-and wished to nake some money, in order to live easy in his old days, and that, if Sarsaparilla under the name of Townsend sold so well, and so much money was made by it, he could see no reason why he might not make something out of it too, (his name being Townsend.) if he could get a capable person to prepare a recipe, and manufacture it for him.
