That some time in the latter part of May, or first of June, 1848, a man by the name of Jacob Townsend, who at that time was a book and pumphlet peddler, called upon deponent, at the house of Mr. Thompson, No. 42 Hudson-street, where deponent boarded, and requested deponent to write him a recipe by which to make a Syrup of Samaparilla. Deponent further says, that he became acquainted with said Townsend at the office of Theodore Foster Evq., Rock Fublisher, with whom said Townsend dealt. That said Townsend had had frequent conversations with dependent respecting the manufacture of an article of Samaparilla to be sold under the name of Dr.

That said Townsend stated he was an old man, and poor, and was not lit for hard labor-and wished to make some money, in order to live easy in his old days, and that, if Sarsaparills under the name of Town-send sold so well, and so much money was made by it, he could see no reason why he might not make something out of it too (his name being Townsend,) if he could get a capable person to prepare a recipe, conversations asked said Townsond of he was related to Dr. S.
