

SWEARING WITNESSES.

We copy from the Presbyterian the following in relation to administering oaths to persons who are to testify before the Courts and jury.

"Strange to say, our Courts, for hundreds of years, have persistently enforced perjury on every witness sworn before them, and the object in writing this article is to attract the attention of one who has power and ability to abate this evil by legislative action."
