OUR NOMINEES.

Our county, as a whole, has no nominees or nominees for Congress, but those Messrs Shawalter and McJunkin will attend the Congressional convention with their delegates.

Senator Shawalter was born in Fayette county in 1851, taught school when a young man, came to Butler County in 1873, and has since been engaged in producing oil. He was elected to the Legislature in 1886, and to the State Senate in 1894, and has taken an active interest in public affairs and politics.

J. David McJunkin was born in Centre town, in 1859, taught school when a young man, read law with Judge McJunkin, and has been a practicing attorney since. He has also been interested in the production of oil. He carried Butler county in 1886, and 1892 for Congress, but did not succeed in securing the nomination in the district, then composed of Butler, Mercer and Crawford counties.

William H. Ritter our nominee for State Senate, was born in Allegheny county in 1843. He began life as a salesman, and has spent the greater part of his life in the dry goods business. James N. Moore one of our nominees for Assembly, was born in Worth town in 1859. He taught school when a young man, read law with Judge McJunkin, and has been a practicing attorney since. He has also been interested in the production of oil. He carried Butler county in 1886, and 1892 for Congress, but did not succeed in securing the nomination in the district, then composed of Butler, Mercer and Crawford counties.

For Sheriff our nominee is W. B. Dadds of Middlesex township. He passed most of his boyhood with an uncle in Franklin township. When but sixteen years of age he went west and lived for a time on a farm near the city of St. Louis, while there joined the 10th Illinois cavalry, then home on a furlough and was with them till the close of the war. His regiment was mustered out of service at San Antonio, Texas. He is 50 years of age, has lived in Muddybrook township for the past 25 years, and has been a resident of this county since 1874. Three years ago he came within 8 votes of making the nomination for Register and Recorder, and this year he was elected as clerk of the court, and has all the necessary qualifications for the office for which he was nominated, and will undoubtedly be elected.

For Register and Recorder our nominee is W. J. Adams of Centre township. He was born at Brady's Bend and raised in Washington township. He sold his farm and for some years engaged in the mercantile business in Hilliards. He afterwards was employed on the railroad, and lost his left hand by an accident. Three years ago he came within 8 votes of making the nomination for Register and Recorder, and this year he was elected as clerk of the court, and has all the necessary qualifications for the office for which he was nominated, and will undoubtedly be elected.

For County Auditor our nominee is Robert J. Thompson our nominee for Prothonotary was born in West Sunbury in 1863. In April of 1864, shortly after the civil war broke out, he enlisted in Co. H, 4th Pa. Vol. and afterwards transferred to Co. E of the 10th. He was taken prisoner in April of 1864, and passed the following winter in the Confederate military prisons at Andersonville, Charleston and Florence. He taught school for 3 years, and was afterwards a read law in Iowa and was admitted to the bar. He came back to this county in 1869, engaged in the production of oil, and was a partner in the firm of Greese City and Troutman; was Postmaster at W. Sunbury during Harrison's administration, and is now a resident of that town.

Isaac Meals our nominee for Clerk of Courts was born in Washington township, and raised in Concord. He taught school when a young man and afterwards farmed. He was elected a County Auditor in 1874, has clerked for the commissioners for the past 6 years. He was a candidate for this office some years ago, but was unsuccessful, but this time was more fortunate, and he will, no doubt, make a very acceptable Clerk of Courts.

For County Commissioner our nominees are Harmon Seaton and John Mitchell.

Mr. Seaton was born in Washington township, fifty-four years ago. During the war he was a member of the 10th Pa. Vol., and 18th cavalry. He served 3 years and was wounded and had a thigh bone broken at Fair Oaks. Since the war he has been a farmer and carpenter. Mr. Seaton has always taken an active interest in public affairs, and is an expert in the production of oil, and is an expert in the production of oil, and is an expert in the production of oil.

Mr. Mitchell was born in Summit township, seven years ago, but has passed the greater part of his life in Butler. He was engaged in the lumber, livery and other businesses.

He was appointed Sheriff of the county in 1878, and Co. Commissioner last year. He was third in the race for the nomination for Co. Commissioner three years ago, and his nomination this year was generally conceded.

W. S. Moore one of our candidates for Auditor, was born and raised in Muddybrook township, is fifty-two years of age, and a farmer by occupation. He taught school in his younger days and is now a Justice of the Peace.

O. K. Thorne of Clay township, our other nominee is a school teacher and yet a young man. He is a good accountant and will make an excellent County Auditor.

P. H. Schlier of Prospect, our nominee for Corner, is also a young man, and a marble cutter by trade. He is a light, handsome and gentlemanly fellow, and if we must have an "up" for somebody would as soon have it be Schlier as any other man.

This State has ordered the printing of the first volumes of the laws of Pennsylvania passed prior to 1860, and not hitherto published.
