

POSSESSIONS OF SPAIN WHERE PER-PETUAL SUMMER REIGNS. They Stretch About 2,000 Miles From East Above 90 Degrees—The Natives Are Seml-Savages and Warlike. If the United States should obtain

control of the Philippine Islands, it would then be only a question of a short while until the Caroline Islands pass into American rule. The Caroline Islands over which Spain now holds the equator, and in a climate of perranges from 74 degrees to 87 degrees through the year.
