THE CHINESE WAR.

During the latter part of last week the news from China indicated that the country was preparing to fight the whole civilized world.

On the other hand the allied forces at Tien Tsin were not yet strong enough to advance upon Peking, and had not yet agreed upon a commander in chief.

On Saturday Prince Tuan was reported defeated and killed by Chinese, in a battle among themselves, a report that was likely a fake.

On Tuesday a dispatch from London bore as follows: After long weeks of anxiety, the suspense felt in Great Britain with regard to the safety of the British legation at Peking, has been relieved by the receipt this morning of the following message from Sir Claude MacDonell.

The British legation at Peking, from June 20 to July 4 was repeatedly attacked by Chinese troops, and the sides with both rifles and artillery fire.

On Tuesday morning, July 21, through the Chinese army occupied three great camps within sight of Tien Tsin.

Col. Daggett is in charge of military operations on the Tien Tsin river. Lt. Col. Coolidge, now at Tien Tsin, transmitted the following from Col. Shibley, dated July 27.

"PEKIN, July 27, evening.—We are all waiting impatiently for the arrival of reinforcements. When you see me I will let you know how the situation is."
