THE ROAD DRAG.

Lively Interest In It-The Kind of Road It Makes.

The road drag has had a veritable

sun and wind act on this moist coating it hardens. Then the constant tamping by horses and the wheels of make of clay and use in their slungshots. The next dragging places another layer of mud over the surface of the road to be firmed in the same man This is repeated so often that the road finally acquires a hide or shield which is almost impervious to rain, shedding water like a metal roof. After two or three years it will remain hard and smooth throughout th year, and drivers can go at a rapid clip over it any time except when covpered with ice. The bottom never falls but of it. Vehicles and wagons cannot cut grooves into it. Being smooth ill over, traveling is distributed over the entire surface. Two or three bug gles, for example, can travel it side by side. The road is of course higher at the middle than at either side. At the start it may be lower in the center than at the sides, though most road on which the common four horse graders have been used are slightly elevat ed in the middle. The drag is made so that it will work up an elevation in the center. Four or five draggings will establish the oval characteristic in
