FIELD AND GARDEN

PASTURING PIGS.

Portable Sleeping Houses, Feed Rooms, and other appliances. Bacon production seems to be looking up in this country. Canada is supposed to have this business reduced to a science. Pasturing plays an important part in the production of meat, and where pigs are pastured extensively proper preparation is made. In the first place, pig proof fences must surround the whole pasture area. Probably the cheapest fence for this purpose will be found to be woven wire. A board fence is very effective.

POPULAR GARDENING

"It is a pity to let the weeds go to seed now. A last sowing of early table beets may be made. Spinach for fall marketing may be sown now. Flat early turnips are a good thing to sow on the vacant ground where crops have been removed. Keep the soil stirred about the late cabbage plants. Late peas, lettuce and winter radishes are sown in August. By taking advantage of a time when the ground is moist, beans may be sown for your table in August. The stringless green pod might be tried. Turnips are often sown broadcast, but sowing in drills makes it easier to thin and cultivate them. The fall gardeners might try a last sowing of an early variety of sweet corn. When favorable weather holds on a good corn is sometimes picked late in October. The early banking of celery is often the cause of rot. Some gardeners say banking should not begin until the middle of September. The lettuce plants that are going to seed may be pulled up, and poultry manure will help them amazingly. Frequent hoeing and a little liquid manure will help eggplants along very much. POWER OF MIND. Always a Valuable Asset in Presence of Danger. Presence of mind is always an asset.
