On motion, George M. Phillips, Charles Rowan, S. D. Adair, Samuel Schwartz, and Dr. Alfred Creigh, were appointed a committee to draft resolutions, expressive of the sense of the meeting, who reported the following, which were unanimously adopted.

This closes the first day's civic entertainment of this "opening"—and other strong ligaments has been thrown round the interest of this great Valley, and as the space between the two extremes has nearly been annihilated, may the "road" promote the most kind and social intimacies.
