Woods, James Woods, John Hetrick, and others, containing 103 acres, 42 perches, to secure the payment of ten bonds of \$250 each, from the 1st of April, 1822, till the 1st of April, 1831, inclusive; and that the said Samuel Reetem, Esq., purchased the said land from Jacob Weise, and executed a mortgage of it, to the said Jacob Weise, to secure the purchase money \$2000, in annual payments of \$400 each, from the 1st of April, 1830, to the 1st of April, 1834, inclusive, which said purchase money has all been paid in discharge of the mortgage of Jacob Weise to John Sheffer by an agreement of the parties.
