PROCEEDINGS OF THE LEGISLATURE.—Our report of the proceedings of the legislature can be given in a few words.

A bill to borrow ONE MILLION TWO HUNDRED AND EIGHTY THOUSAND DOLLARS at five per cent. has passed both branches.

Another bill to borrow SIX HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS at the same percentage has also passed.
