David Emminger, Abraham Waggoner and John Dunlap, Esquires, Directors of the Poor and of the House of Employment of Cumberland county, in account with said county, for the 1st day of January to the 31st day of December, 1838, inclusive, viz:

Stock on Farm 1st Jan. 1839. 5 head of horses, 26 head of horned cattle, 5 breeding sows, 53 sheep, 20 sheep, Farming Utensils, 2 narrow wheeled wagons, 1 wagon bed, 1 pair wood ladders, 1 dearbon & harness, 1 cart with gears, 3 ploughs, 3 harrows, 1 roller, 7 wheelbarrows, 1 winnowing mill, 1 scoop, 3 log chains, 6 set of wagon gears, 4 set of plough gears, 2 shovel harrows, 2 flax brakes, 2 set carpenter tools, 1 set butchering tools, and a variety of axes, shovels, spades, grubbing hoes, digging irons, single trees, double trees, scythes, cradles, forks, rakes, &c.
