Beef, pork, mutton and veal, fattened and killed on farm in 1838; 24 beeves, weight 11,773 lbs. 40 hogs, weight 6,413 lbs. 23 sheep, weight 10,433 lbs. 10 calves, weight 848 lbs. whole amount weight 20,077 lbs.

There was also made and manufactured in the House and Shop 267 yards of tow & flax linen, 515 yards of bagging, 90 yards of fatnel, 31 1/2 yards of rags- 189 shirts and chemise, 75 calico frocks, 67 pair of summer pantaloons, 102 pair of knitted stockings, 65 pair of footed stockings, 65 sheets 60 aprons, 18 chaff bags, 45 caps, 131 feather pillow slips and bolsters, 3100 dipped and moulded candles, 37 comforters.

The directors of the Poor, &c. of said County annex the following exhibit of extra labor, &c. performed by the Steward, Matron and Paupers, from the 1st day of January, to the 31st day of December 1838, as follows, viz:

Filled up and leveled one acre of a pond 12 inches deep for meadow, made a flowerhouse and toolhouse, 2 cabins in the hospitals for close stools, 20 coffins, 9 large and 20 small benches 1-panel door, 7 small windows, made and nailed 44 panel of pailing fence, made 3 small and 1 large gates, made a rack to feed sheep, made 1 wheelbarrow wheel, made 1 small library case, made 22 splitting boxes, made 18 pot lids, made 2 rakes, glazed the Poor House and Dwelling, cut 80 loads of wood, made 700 new rails, made 10 hickory brooms, and a variety of other articles made and repaired, made 3 roundabouts, made 40 pair woolen pantaloons, made 20 vests, boiled 30 barrels soft soap, made 143 lbs. hard soap, colored all the wool and yarn.

Whole number admitted up to the 31st of December 1838 inclusive, (of which 20 were colored and 9 out door paupers admitted at short periods), 220

Making the whole number through the year, 330

Out door paupers supported at public expense through the year, 3

Whole number supported 1st January 1839, 123
