

Pennsylvania, O. K.

"We have met the enemy and they are ours."

The cohorts of the National and State Administrations—the Office Holders and Drill Sergeants of the men in power at Washington and Harrisburg, thanks to the virtue and zeal of the People, have been signally overthrown in Pennsylvania, and that hitherto strong fortress of Locofocoism taken by storm at the ballot-boxes. We say we have beaten the Van Buren party in Pennsylvania—that the cause of *Harrison & Reform* triumphed most gloriously on the 13th of October in the Old Keystone. And why do we say so? Because the result has exceeded our anticipations. Because we have redeemed the Senate in spite of the patronage and power of the State and National Administrations, corruptly, audaciously, and tyrannically employed against us. We have borne down and walked over the 50,000 Office Holders and workmen in the employ of the State Administration. We have baulked the hordes of Post Masters, Custom House Officers, Marshals and Deputy Marshals employed against us. We have carried the Chester District, the Bucks District, and the York and Lancaster Districts, in spite of James Cameron and all the Bullies and bought-up votes thrown into them. This result is, of itself, a glorious achievement—worthy of celebration—and fully enough justifies the cry of VICTORY! But we do not stop here. The House of Representatives, which last year was against us by a majority of 40, is now either with us, or so nearly with us that the power of the Locos to do further evil against the credit and currency of the Commonwealth is paralyzed. Nor is even this all that we have gained. In the present Congress the Delegation from Pennsylvania stands 11 Whigs, 17 Locofocos; in the next Congress, which comes into power after the 4th of March next, we shall certainly have 13, and probably 14 members—having gained 1 in Bucks, 1 in Huntingdon, and 1 in Washington counties, and lost but 1 in Philadelphia county. But our Van Buren opponents say they have from 10 to 15,000 majority of the popular vote. That's *gammon*. They have no such thing—it is barely possible that they have any majority—and certainly not over 3000. They make large claims just now for effect. They don't mind *lying* when their political salvation is at stake, and depending upon the production of a certain result. The bulletins of the Harrisburg Keystone, Gazette, Reporter and Magician, and of the American Volunteer, are filled with gross misrepresentations, and scattered far and wide to deceive the people. Even the Locofoco State Central Committee—seared at the lowering aspect of the political sky—has taken the field and issued a budget of falsehoods to rally the broken and scattered ranks of the party once more to the contest. Let our *Whig* brethren rejoice at these significant signs of the sudden and signal downfall of these Traitors to Honesty and enemies of the Public Liberty. Whenever we see any faction resorting to base means, we may be sure that its end

draweth nigh. The presses of this used up faction of Robespierian levellers, have not the honesty or the courage to inform their readers that within four weeks they have lost Maine, Maryland, and Georgia. They claim Maine in opposition to the clearest testimony. They raised a shout of victory over Baltimore city and county—but they did not tell their good friends that Maryland had given a Harrison majority of 2500. They passed over little Delaware in silence—and to judge by the barrenness of their columns, the tidings of Georgia's loss has not reached them. On the 13th New Jersey vindicated the broad seal by a majority of about 1600, and a large majority in the Legislature. But they will not acknowledge a defeat there—and when the news from Ohio shall pour in upon us, and 3000 majority for Corwin stare them in the face, they will shut their eyes and refuse to see it. When they will not acknowledge their defeats in other states, how can we expect them to confess that they are whipped in Pennsylvania? They won't do it until they shall be so badly knocked down and tramped upon as to become perfect scorpions, helpless and hopeless. They will lie on, without intermission until that time—and we tell our friends, wherever this extra may find them—to place no confidence in Locofoco Bulletins issued between this and the Presidential election. There will be scarcely any truth in them. Rely upon it, our prospects in Pennsylvania were never so good. It is possible that even at the election of the 13th, the popular vote was cast in our favor—but even if it shall prove to be 3600 or 5000 against us—the state will nevertheless be perfectly safe for HARRISON on the 30th, if our friends will once more rush in a body to the polls and deposit their ballots. If you hear any Locofoco say that Berks county has given a Van Buren majority of 6000, tell him it is not true. Remember that our party ran no ticket on the 13th, and to come at the actual majority we must subtract about 3500 from the vote polled by the Locos. Mark what we say, Berks will not give Van Buren at the outside over 3500. We subjoin returns as far as received—and shall issue Extras every day or two from this to the election.
