Among the largest and most important work on our canal line, is the construction of the Reservoir near Hollidaysburg. For this work three offers were made, and the contract given to a political friend...

For common excavation below water two contractors offered, one twenty and one twenty-four cents, but Mr. Mitchell offered thirty-three cents, and he has the contract.

For good earth embankment, one contractor offered nineteen cents, another seventeen cents, and Mr. Mitchell has it for thirty cents, and so it will appear throughout, till it is demonstrable that the loss to the commonwealth in this one work will not be less than twenty thousand dollars.

On the western reservoir, it was ascertained that it cost the state upwards of twenty thousand dollars, to clear from timber about four hundred acres.

Had no other inducement existed, there would have been in this disclosure enough to justify immediate action and a change in the tenure of these canal commissioners. A bill was immediately introduced to that effect, with the design of changing the tenure of the canal commissioners.

THE REVENUE BILL PASSED.
