Proposed Amendment to the Constitution. "Resolution relative to the Amendment of the State Constitution. RESOLVED by the Se. and H. of Representatives in General Assembly met, That the Constitution of this State be amended in the third section of the second article, so that it shall read as follows: "That the Governor shall hold his office during three years, from the third Tuesday of January next ensuing his election, and shall not be capable of holding it longer than a single term of three years, in any term of nine years."
