STATE CREDIT.—The language of Mr. Tyler, in his Message, touching the faith of the States, strikes us as highly opportune and correct, and we think it will be responded to by the State Executives. We believe that we may safely vouch for the Governor of Pennsylvania; that not only will he say that the money is ready for the creditor the first day on which it becomes due, but that the honor of the Commonwealth shall not suffer, while he has the power to gather on any quarter the means of meeting her responsibilities.

CONGRESS.—We repeat the expression, says the Alexandria Gazette, "of our great desire that this session may be a short one—that the members of Congress may deliberate and act for the good of their country, and not for the interests of party—that electioneering be voted a bore and eschewed altogether—that kind and friendly feelings may prevail to the exclusion of passion and prejudice—and that the theories of two-penny politicians and demagogues may be made to give place to the measure of practical statesmen and true patriots."

IN THE FIELD.—The Albany Regency, flushed with their success in the late elections, have at length, though with much seeming caution, brought Mr. Van Buren's name before the public, in the columns of the Argus, as a candidate for re-election to the office of President of the United States. Judging from what we saw and heard a few days recently passed in Albany, we had thought that the old Bourbons had troubles enough on their hands for one season, without thus early casting another ingredient into the bitter waters of political strife.

THE REVENUE BILL.—The London Post of the 8th October, in speaking of the Revenue Bill passed at the late Extra Session of Congress, highly approves of some of its provisions. It particularly approves of that portion of the bill which provides for the taxation of importations of goods, and the duties on such articles.

A meeting of the Whigs of Orange county, North Carolina, has nominated HENRY CLAY of Ky., for President of the United States. Senators MANSON and GRAHAM were present and advocated the nomination.

SENATOR PRESTON.—A correspondent of the Charleston Mercury repeats from Columbia, S. C., the rumor of Senator Preston's intended resignation, and says it is hinted that Governor McDuffie will accept the seat for the unexpired term or a longer period. Mr. Preston waits to see the President's message before he decides on his course.

C. from South Carolina, intends resigning his seat as representative in Congress, in consequence of a determination to remove to the Western country. Messrs. Charles R. Carroll and S. W. Trotter, of Barnwell District, will be candidates for the vacancy.
