

Arrival of the Britannia.
The steamship Britannia arrived in Boston harbor, on Monday morning, the 18th inst. in thirteen and a half days from England.
There is no news of importance. The most important event, is the account of a very destructive fire, which occurred in Liverpool, on the 23d ult. Early on that morning, flames were discovered in a bonfire of a shop, in the immediate vicinity of the docks, at the north end of the town. The alarm was immediately given, but before assistance could be procured, the flames had spread with such violence and rapidly, as to baffie all attempts to subdue the devouring elements. They raged with considerable violence for some hours, destroying a number of large warehouses with the stores contained in them, together with many other descriptions of buildings. The estimated amount of the value of property consumed, is half a million of pounds sterling. Below will be found the particulars of this dreadful catastrophe. A second fire occurred in the same vicinity, two or three nights after the above, which had excited a good deal of attention from the fact, that it is supposed that a man named Doran set fire to his own dwelling, with a view of getting the money for which he was insured. This second fire did considerable damage.

The London papers have been much engaged in discussing the merits and demerits of the treaty lately concluded between Great Britain and the United States, and the general tendency of what has been written appears to incline the belief that it is generally considered to favor the United States, and of course prejudicial to Great Britain.

From what we can gather from the leading journals, it is considered that England has made many concessions which are not only prejudicial, but actually dishonorable to her. It is argued that Great Britain has given up by this treaty to the Americans, two-thirds of an extensive territory, to the whole of which recent surveys prove her justly entitled. Again it is argued that Great Britain, has virtually acknowledged the claim of the United States, to the third, which has been retained by England, because it is argued to purchase that third by giving the people of Maine a right, freely to navigate the St. John from its source to its mouth through the British Province of New Brunswick.

The recent riots in the manufacturing districts are again about to attract a good deal of public attention by the opening of a Special Commission for the trial in them. Feargus O'Connor and thirteen others of the gang of "Charter" men had been arrested.

The trade in the manufacturing districts, and generally throughout the country has not undergone any change of moment since the sailing of the last steamer. The London Money market has been somewhat more animated, and the value of stocks had a tendency to improve.

FRANCE.—The French papers are principally occupied with the American tariff, which generally speaking, they disapprove. The Monitor, however, finds that the products of France are more favorably dealt with by it than those of any other country.

According to the Courier Francaise, "the English cabinet was on the point of making a generous concession to the United States, by throwing open the harbors of Great Britain to American wheat." "This exception in favor of America," it says, "may be regarded as a measure of reprisal against Russia and the German States, who are endeavoring to prohibit the products of English manufactures."

It would appear that the French government confident of the maintenance of peace, continues to have immemorial reductions in the land force of France.

RUSSIA.—The news from Circassia and Daghestan continued to be unfavorable to the Russian arms. "In the former, the insurgents had gained fresh advantages over the invaders, and possessed themselves of several fortifications along the coast of the Black Sea, and in Daghestan different tribes of the country had entered into an offensive and defensive league, and defeated the Russians in various encounters."

Spain.—Queen Isabella II. of Spain completed her 13th year on the 12th of October, when according to the text of the old Spanish law, the majority ceases. The functions of the Regent would therefore cease on that day.

A Re-Union.
The Washingtonians had a mass-convention at Medina, Ohio, last week. During its progress, Judge Smith, who had, about a year previous, been divorced from his wife for his intemperate habits and brutal neglect and abuse of his family, made a speech, at the close of which he "was reunited to his wife—the minister exclaiming: 'What God hath rejoined, let neither man nor angel sever.' Who will say that temperance is not of God!"
