Made by the Commissioners in compliance with the requisitions contained in the twenty-second and twenty-third sections of an act of Assembly of this Commonwealth, passed on the fifteenth day of April, A. D. 1834. And also in conformity with the thirty-seventh section of the same act, which requires the County Treasurer, once in every year, to state his account and produce his vouchers to the Commissioners, which after examination by said Commissioners, shall be by them laid before the County Auditors for settlement according to law.
