War Duties in Mexico
The Washington Union of Thursday last contains a letter from the President to the Secretary of the Treasury, relative to the expenses of the military operations in Mexico. The Secretary says the regulations adopted by the Secretary, upon the part of Mexico and California, which are now as may be in possession of the forces of the United States to the commerce of all nations, subject to certain regulations established by our government. All goods are to be entered in the same manner as is regarded by existing regulations in our own ports. A scale of duties has been established, which are to be collected, levied and paid, and which are to be appropriated to defray the expenses of the war. The military commanders of the various ports are to officiate as revenue collectors and surveyors, and the tide waiters will no doubt range from first sergeants to sixth corporals. I understand this Mexican tariff is entirely specific in its character, and very properly so, as it will be far more onerous in its effect upon the Mexicans.
