FROM THE CALIFORNIA PARTY,

Steamboat 'Oriental,' Miss. River,

April 3d. 1849. We left Cincinnati about 5 o'clock, r We left Cincinnati about 5 o'clock, p. m. on the 30th, and reached Louisville, Ky. about 11 a. m. where we stopped to dis-charge freight. This is quite a smart city, lighted with gas, and doing a large whole-sale business. Most of the dry goods boxes were marked from Philadelphia, and from houses familiar to us. There are a great many dealers along the streat fronting the many dealers along the street fronting the river, who have fancy articles, bowie knives, pistols, cards obscend broks, &c. exposed to sale in glass cases. Here fips, leves and light quarters pass only as helf dimes, dimes and twenty cent pieces, and pennies are not taken at all

taken at all The country approaching Louisville pre-sents a flatter appearance than hitherto, and as we approach it spreads out into a broad and apparently interminable low ground.— The peach, plum and Junebeny trees are in plossom, and the cotton tree and sugar maple putting out leaves. Young ontons, cabbage sprouts, &c. are for sale in the mar-

ket. Sunday, 1st day of April was a glorious day, as penutiful as an unclouded sky, genial sun, in pient vegetation and a placid sheet of water could make it. Most of the passen-gers were more neatly dressed and more sedate than usual. All amusements were laid aside, and most betook themselves to reading-some I observed poring over their Testaments. We passed during the course of the day

the noble Ohio, and during the night we en-tered the Mississippi, and commenced stem-ming its current. Its banks near the mouth are overflown, and the forest of cotton wood trees prevents us from discovering the extent

of its surface. On the morning of the 2d, we learned that a case of Chelera had occurred among the boat hands. It terminated stally in the alternoon. It was stated, however, that he had suffered under diarrhoa several days, and had taken nothing to check it. The announcement of the disease being aboard, created some excitement, but not as much as would have been supposed. We had fearned before leaving Pittsburg that cases were occurring on the boats, particularly those coming from New Orlenne, by which it was distributed at various points. We had propared ourselves to pass where it was, and have been very careful not to expose ourselves to night air, unwholecome diet ourselves to night ar, unwholesome dier, and in case of symptome to check them prompily. We hope for the best and our trust is in Providence. The deceased was buried in the symptomet dusk in a seques-


