On the 13th instrathe memorial of the Senators and Representatives elect from California was presented in branches of Congress, praying for the immediate admission of California as a State of the Union. The memorialists lay before those bodies certified copies, of the constitution of California, together with their credentials, and they request, in the name of the people of their State, her admission into the Union. They express "deep astonishment and sincere regret at having learned, since their arrival in Washington, of the existence of an organized, respectable, and talented opposition to the admission of the new State." They add:

"This opposition is so unexpected, so important in numbers attl-ability, and so decided in its sectional character, that they feel they should deminustice to their constituents, to the cause of good govern-ment, and to the progressive advance of freedom and civilization, did they not at least attempt to abswer the many arguments urged against the admission of

Then follows, at length, a history of the territory and of the organization of a State. As regards slavery, the memorial says:

Much misapprehension appears to have obtained in the Atlantic States relative to the question of Slavery in California. The undersigned have no hesitancy in saying that the provision in the Constituthe almost unanimous approval of that people. This unanimity is believed to result not so much from the prejudices against the system which are quite general in the northern portion of the United States, as from a universal conviction that in no portion of Californiasis the cli mate and soil of a character adapted to slave labor. Since the discovery of the mines, the feeling in opposition to the introduction of Slavery is believed to have become, if possible, more unanimous than heretofore. The relation of master and slave has never existed in the country, and is there generally believed to be pro hibited by Mexican law, consequently the original California population is utterly opposed to it. Slavery is a question little discussed in California, so settled appears the public mind relative thereto. Public meetings have scarcely ever considered it. The opinion putifor ward that the decision of this question has been forestalled, has no foundation in truth. And no more conclusive proof of this can be found than the simple facts that fifteen of the forty eight members composing the convention which unanimously inserted the prohibitory clause in the Constitution, were from slaveholding states, while twelve were California proper, and twenty one northern men. Fur ther than this, there is no doubt that two fifths of those who voted in favor of the constitution were recent emigrants from slavelinding states, while it is known that many of the votes given against the instrament were so given in consequence of the failure of the messengers to dis-. , tribute the printed copies in several mining localities, No debate upon the subject was had in the convention, though "somy conversation" ensued upon a proposition to submit the provision to the people for a seperate vote. This was suggested by northern men and did not pre-

nil.

The memorialists lay down the follow-

ing important points:

1. That a territorial Government, under the revisory power of Congress, which a far from promoting the interests of California, so circumscribe its energies, prevent the development of its capacities, and impode its general advancement, as to be a source of discontent, difficulty and ultimate ruin, either to the government of government.

2. That the wonderful increase of the country in population, in wealth, and consequently percial, social and political importance, in commercial, social and pointiest importance, renders imperatively necessary the adoption of such a system of measures as can only be en-acted by a State Legislature, and enforced by

a State Government.
3. That the neglect and oppression of the United States Congress forced California to form a State Government, if she desired to avoid civil strife and anarchy.
And, 4. That the people of that country did not adopt such form of government in obedience to dictation from the executive here, throgen. Riley there; but, on the contrary, actual, ly took the iniative in the movement, and only iniative in the movement, and only concurred in the suggestion of the de facto Gov-ernor, as a matter of course, to save time, and with a patriotic resolution to merge all minor differences of opinion in one unanimous effort to avert impending ills and remedy existing e-

As regards the boundaries of the State, the memorial says that they were adopted by way of compromise, the debates on the subject in the constitutional convention having been of a very angry description. The memorial urges that, although the area of the State, 155,550 square miles, seems very large, yet onehalf of it is covered by mountains, and half the residue is a desert waste, so that only one fourth is useful for agricultural purposes, that is, 38,687; square miles, or 24,888,000 square acres of arable and productive land. This estimate is fully borne out by the topographical surveys of the country; but, anxious as the memorialists are to avoid misstatement, they do not hesitate to assert their belief that three-fifths of the whole territory embraced in the State of California will never be susceptible of cultivation, or useful to man. This would give, as the romaining two fifths, 62,320 square miles, which would constitute the sum total of valuable arable and and grazing land embraced within the boundary, and distributed at intervals over the whole surface of the

Country.

They estimate the population of California on the 1st of January last, to have amounted to 107,060; of which number 70,069 were Americans, 13000 Californians, and 18,000 foreigners.
