"Capt. French has extended his oper-ations to the Mexican fronter. He made a contract with Mr. Coons on the Pecos, to deliver all his government stores at El Paso, purchased all his wagons, mules &c., and gave him a draft for \$17,000 on Howland & Aspinwall, which Maj. Henry has in his possession.

As soon as he had go: the wagons and government stores in his possession he started Westward, pretending that he should proceed immediately to El Paso, to deliver the stores to the government agents ; but nothing has been heard from him since, and it is supposed that he has gone to the Presidio del Norte, and thence to Chihuahua. Fears were entertained that he has sold out the gov-

ernment stores, wagons, &c., abandoned his passengers, fled with the money ob tained by his numerous frauds in the in terior of Mexico.

He was furnished with government stores, during the whole time that he travelled with the train after it started from the frontier, and Major Henry thinks he forged an order to induce the officer in charge of the train to furnish his passengers with the articles they required on the journey."
