the General Assembly of this Com-monwealth, passed the 10th day of April, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine; entitled "An Ast to create a Sixking Funn, and to provide for C GRADUAL AND CERTAIN EXTINGUISHMENT OF THE DEBT OF THE COMMONWEALT," it is an act-ed and provides as follows, viz: SEC. 1. That the Scoretary of the Com-monwealth, Auditor General and State Treas-

monwealth, Auditor General and State Treas-uror, for the time being, shall be Commission-ers, who are hereby authorized to receive the revenues appropriated by this act, or which may hereafter be appropriated for the same object, and to purchase therewith the debt of the State of Pennsylvania at its market price, if not exceeding the par value, thereach, to the full@extent of the said revenues, and to hold and apply the same, and the interest thereon accorning, firmly and, inviolably on the trusts and for the purposes hereinafter specified. Sec. 2. That all revenues derived from the following sources, to wit: the taxes on collat-

following sources, to wit: the taxes on collatoral inheritances, and the per centage assessed upon any bank or railroad, or coal 'mining, or 'miliroad and coal mining, or improvement com-pany charter, all taxes assessed on distillerios pany charter, all taxes assessed on distillarios and breweribs, or billiard rooms, bowling sa-loons and fen pin allers, on new counties, on theatrical, circus and menagorio exhibitions, and on eaving houses, beer houses and restau-rants, and all such revenues as the Legislature-may from thine to time set apart for the pur-poses mentioned in this act, shall, so sood, as the same shall be received at the Treasury, be paid over to the said Commissioners, sho shall forthwith proceed to purchase the debts of the Commonwealth, on the torms and for the pur-poses set forth in the first section of this net. Szc. 3. That the said Commissioners shall

That the said Commissioners shall be authorized to receive the interest due and payable on the debt, so as aforesaid purchased and held by them, which interest shall be likewise applied to the purchase of said debt, so that the same shall form a constantly accumu-lating fund for the extinguishment of the pub-

lic debt. SEC. 4. That it shall be the duty of the said Commissioners, on the first Monday of Septem-ber, in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one, and on the same day, in every-third year thereafter, to certify the amount of the debt of the Commonwealth held by them, to the Gorganor, who shall divect the certify to the Governor, who shall direct the certifi-cates representing the same to be cancelled, and on such cancellation issue his proclama-tion, stating the fact and the exting islament and final discharge of so much of the principal of solid debt. of said debt.
