ARRIVAL OF THE CANADA.

Heart Rending Disaster at Sea.

LOSS OF THE STEAMER ARCTIC WITH NEARLY ALL HER PASSENGERS AND CREW—THIRTY SAVED!

Hullis, October 10, 1854.

The Canadian steamer Canada arrived at this port this evening.

The most important intelligence is a heart-rending narrative of the loss of the steamer Arctic with nearly every soul of her large number of passengers and crew.

The collision occurred on the 28th of September, off Cape Race, New Foundland.

The Arctic was running at a speed of thirty-three knots per hour. A dense fog prevailed.

While thus running she came into collision with a steam-propeller, containing a regiment of British troops lately embarked from Canada to join the army in the East.

The shock of the collision was slight at first and did not cause much alarm.

Soon however water commenced pouring in at the Arctic's bows.

The water rapidly gained however and caused the extinguishment of the fire and the stoppage of the engine.

The passengers formed in gangs to work the pumps more vigorously, but to no avail.

The boats were then let down and many of the passengers immediately rushed into them, leaving a few passengers and ships' officers behind.

Signal guns were now fired and the construction of a full complement of the most reliable pumps now provided, and passengers rushed to the aid of the life boats in their danger.

The men were after several hours of the most piercing cries from those on board, the scene was truly horrible.

The fate of the life boats is unknown. Thirty-two persons, mostly ship's company, were picked up by ship Lebanon and barque Huron.

The Arctic left Liverpool with over 400 passengers and crew.

Of this large number but thirty-two are known to be saved.

The fate of the propeller, with the troops on board, is unknown.

A more heart-rending disaster has never been recorded.

It will fill with agony the hearts of scores of families in this country.

TWO WEEKS LATER FROM CALIFORNIA.

New York, Oct. 8.—The steamship North-east Light arrived this evening about half past 10 o'clock from San Juan, with 495 passengers and \$960,000 in gold.

The general election in California took place on the 6th of September, and resulted in the success of Messrs. Denver and Herbert, anti-Broderick Democrats, for Congress.

As to the Legislature, the result, as far as heard from, has been that seven Whig Senators and twenty-six Democrats have been elected, and in the House thirty-five Whigs and forty-five Democrats.

It is, however, doubtful whether the Democrats can unite upon a candidate for United States Senator.

In San Francisco, the Know Nothings carried everything before them, and elected their candidate for Mayor, S. P. Webb, formerly Mayor of Salem, Massachusetts, by over 500 plurality.

On the ticket elected were twenty-seven names of Know Nothings, twenty being nominees of the Whig and Anti-Broderick conventions, and seven were nominations made by the Know Nothings only.

Every man was elected, some having 4000 majority.—The Know Nothing vote is about 450 out of 11,000 in the whole city.

The news from the mines continues to be favorable, and the Southern miners are especially more successful than ever.

The overland emigrants are arriving, but not so numerously as in former years.

The Chinese are arriving at the rate of five hundred to a thousand every week.

Most of them are slaves to their more wealthy countrymen.

About the average number of murders and assaults are recorded.
