A ferry skiff was upset in the Hudson river at Troy, yesterday morning, and eleven persons drowned. They were chiefly workmen in a chair factory. The Ohio Election has proved an astounding defeat of the Democratic party.

MONDAY, October 16.

Captain Luce, the commander of the ill-fated steamship Arctic, has arrived safe at Quebec, and furnished an account of the wreck. It appears that after the steamer sunk he rose to the surface, and finding the steamer's paddle-box near him got upon it himself, but his son was struck on the head by the box and killed.

Later!—Safety of Captain Luce.

Never in the annals of a nautical disaster has there been such a preservation, and Providence has saved him for the wise purpose of putting the only veritable seal of condemnation upon the "dastards of the Arctic," which will afford, as every one who knew Captain Luce anticipated, the life of a true sailor, stuck to his vessel to the last, and when she made her final plunge down to the fathomless depths of the ocean, he was engulfed with the whole of the wretched survivors.
