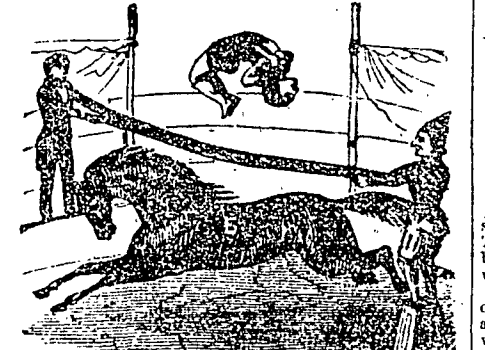

ARRIVAL OF THE BALTIC.

Important War News.—Four Battles in the Crimea.—Sebastopol in Flames.—The Russian Fleet Broken or Sunk.—Eighteen thousand Russians lost in killed and wounded.—22,000 Prisoners Taken.—Great rejoicings in England.

NEW YORK, October 16.—Evening.—The steamship Baltic arrived this evening, at 5 o'clock, with Liverpool dates to Wednesday, the 14th inst., four days later.

About eight hours after the sailing of the Baltic, official news was received of a great battle at the Alma river, in the Crimea.

The Russian troops, under Menschikoff, rallied on the river Tschirsn, and were again defeated and driven to the entrenchments, behind Sebastopol.

The Russian then fled into Sebastopol, which was beleaguered by sea and land by the allied fleets and troops.

The British General officers are reported as being wounded.

The second engagement at Kalantia lasted several hours, and was very sanguinary, ending in the total defeat of the Russians, who were pursued to the entrenchments before Sebastopol.

Some despatches state that the garrison of Sebastopol was offered a free withdrawal, but surrendered as prisoners of war.

The despatches are very conflicting. One dated Berlin, 3d, says that a telegraphic dispatch had been received there direct from St. Petersburg.

The Russian accounts do not conceal the fact of severe reverses having been experienced in the Crimea.
