Grain-There is very little Wheat offering or selling, and prime lots are scarce and generally held above the views of buyers; the only sales we hear of are a few small lots good Penna. Reds at \$199@192 cents, and White at 200 cents. Rve is in steady demand, and 1000 bushels was taken by a distiller at \$1,22 ets. Corn continues in good demand affarather better prices, sales reaching 16(à18,000 bushels, mostly Southern Yellow at 85 cts, for prime new, 87 cents for mixed, and 88 cts. for old, including some lots taken in the market, and some at a price to be fixed. Oats are dull, and offered at 51 cents for Southern; buyers only bid 50 cents 7 bushel.

A NOVEL LAW SUIT .- A suit at law, of so hewhat, a romantic tharacter, has just been terminated in Franklin county. seems that one John Lesher, became pierced with the arrow of Cupid, and wishing to heal the wound by the application of lawful wed-lock, he made proposals to the object of his affections, which, it seems she received favor-ably; but the father Mr. Jacob Wyant, being a prudent man of much foresight, required the said John to enter into bonds o' five hundred dollars, conditioned that the said John Lesher should live with his wife and treat her as a loving and affectionate husband should do. But the parties, after living together some months, separated and this suit was bought to recover the amount of the bond. The case was first tried at the last April term of the Franklin Court, when Judge Kimmell decided the bond to be invalid. The case was carried to the Supreme Court, and it was there decided that the bond was 'good and valid, and in accordance with the policy of the law.' The case therefore came up again in the Franklin county Courts, when the Jury found for the Plaintiff for \$670,75.

The result of this suit may give a valuable suggestion to anxious fathers whose daughters are sought as partners at the Hymenial altar; and imitation of Mr. Wyant's forethought, would show a prudent concern for the daughter's welfare.


