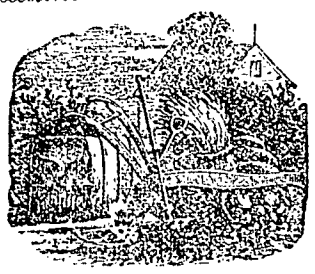


Agricultural.
