LATEST DESPATCHES.

The Chicago Riot. CHICAGO, April 23.—Nothing further of a serious character occurred yesterday or this morning. During yesterday, large crowds continued to collect, but they were dispersed by the police without difficulty. The military are still on guard at the Court House. The total number of arrests already made is 55, and further trouble is apprehended at the examination of the prisoners.

Steamer William Knorr Burned. LOUISVILLE, April 23.—The steamer Wm. Knorr, bound for the Upper Mississippi, was burned yesterday, about 100 miles below this city; but fortunately no lives were lost. The hull sunk in deep water, and everything on board was lost, including the books, money and baggage. The boat was insured.

Appointment by the Governor. HARRISBURG, April 23.—Governor Pollock has appointed Henry Davis, of Philadelphia, aether Inspector, in place of Thomas Hayes, who declined for reasons highly honorable to himself and gratifying to the Governor.

Case of Arrison. CINCINNATI, April 23.—The District Court yesterday granted a writ of error in the case of Arrison, convicted of the murder of Mr. and Mrs. Allison, at the Marine Hospital, and suspended his sentence.

Four Boys Burned to Death. St. Louis, April 23.—During a violent storm on the night of the 17th inst., the Arcadia High School, at the town of Arcadia, in Madison county, was struck by lightning and set on fire. Four boys, pupils of the school, who were asleep in the building, were burned to death.

Non-Arrival of the Africa. HALIFAX, April 23.—The steamship Africa, from Liverpool, has not yet arrived. A steamer was telegraphed in the offing at ten o'clock to-day, supposed to be the Africa, but which proved to be an English war steamer. The Africa's advices will be to the 14th.

Know Nothing Manifesto. Boston, April 23.—The Know Nothings of Massachusetts are about to publish an address, setting forth the objects and aims of the organization. It will be an able document.

FIRE AT YORK.—A fire occurred at York, on Friday morning, which consumed the stables of Gen. Jacob Barnitz and of Hantz, Frick & Co., and another belonging to the German Reformed Church. The Pennsylvaniaian says Gen. Barnitz lost a fine horse and cow, valued at \$130. The stable was only insured for \$200. The loss of Hantz, Frick & Co. is \$300; insurance \$200.
