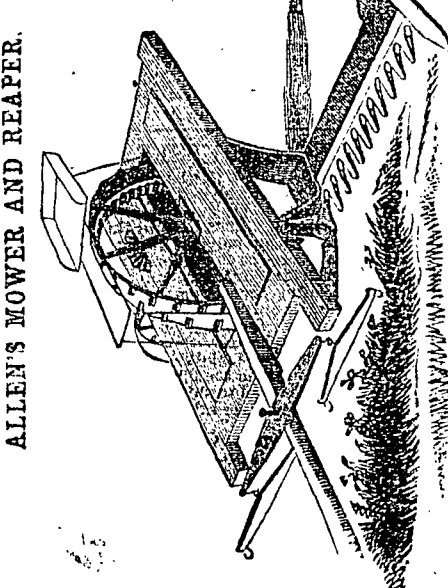
BALTIMORE MARKET.
