Be it ordáfined and enacted by the Tewn Council of the Berough of Carlisie, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the anthority of the same, that the Clerk o, the Market shulf always kéep for the use of hie Corporation, exact standard weights and measures, and shulf be rulate annually the scales, weights and measures within the Borough of Carlisie, according to she standard of the Commonwealth; and it shull be the duty of the sald clerk, at least once in overy year, to go to the stores, houses, stalls, and offices of the makers, venders, or proprietors of beams, and try and adjust (or cause to be adjusted) all beams, scales, well, its and measures, and seal the same with the initials of his last or stumane, and the current year, if which that and adjustment he shulf demand and receive the leftowing fees, to wit:—For the trial and balancing o every set of scales, tor cents; of overy patient balance, twenty cents; of every patient balance, twenty cents; of every patient balance, twenty cents; of every year measure, six cents; for every bushel measure, twenty cents; for overy half-bushel measure, fifteen cents; for every patient balance, two dollars each; on devery year measure, six cents; for poughts or more cents; for every gallon, half-gallon and quart measure, four cents, each; of every pint or less, three cents cach; of every weight, (wenty-eight poughts or more, twelve and a half cents; of cycry weight or hore, twelve and a half cents; of cycry weight or hore.
