A Run through the Patent Office Report.

Under the head of *Textile and Forage Crops*, we have a brief section devoted to the recently introduced *Oregon Pea*. The statements made in the present Report confirm, in a degree, what was published in regard to this plant in the Report for 1853. This plant promises to be of great value as an article of food for horses, mules, cattle, sheep and hogs. Mr. Rozell, of Tenn., says that the hay and pea together are a better and a cheaper food for any of these animals than can be raised from anything else in the United States. He thinks he can raise more and better for his stock from one acre of Oregon Peas, than from five acres of anything else known to him. Horses and cattle devour it either green or dried, with the greatest avidity.
