That they, had -set themselves up wilfully and knowingly to defy the law, but that it had-as it always
- would in the end-proved too strong for them. There was a maximum and minimum period fixed by the law, the amount of the penalty and the duration of the sentence being left' to the discretion of the Court. The sentence of the Court now was, that each of the defendants do pay the costs of prosecution, that they pay a fine of \$50 each, and undergo an imprisonment of 30 days each in the county prison, and stand committed until the sentence be complied with.

Upon the passage of the sentence the prisoners were variously affected, extreme astonishment being, however, the most predominate feeling. It was not dreamed of by any of the parties, that the sentence of imprisonment would be for a longer period than 10 days, but when they heard 30 fixed as the minimum, it created a universal sensation .- After some delay they were accompanied by the Sheriff to the county prison:

Bay A steam boiler in the cellar of Mr. E. 
