The Flour market continues depressed and dull, and holders are more anxious to sell since the receipt of the late foreign news .-Buyers however are not disposed to operate to any extent, and we are only advised of a sale of 500 bbls W. B. Thomas' superfine at \$7, which is a decline. Standard shipping ... brands, made from new wheat are freely of fered, at the same rate, and sound old stock, including late inspected Flour from old wheat, at \$6.50 a 6.75 for standard and better brands, without fluding buyers, except in small lots for home consumption at these figures, and extra and fancy brands at \$7 8 per bbl, as in quality. 
