# ELECTION PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, in and by an act of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, entitled "An Act to amend an act passed April twenty-third, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, relating to the election of county commissioners," passed the day before last, it is enacted, that the duty of the Sheriff of every county within the State shall be to give public notice of the County Elections, and in such manner as may be directed by law;

The Officers to be elected.

And whereas, the place at which the election is to be held,

I, JACOB BOWMAN, High Sheriff of the county of York, do hereby certify that the same will be held at the Court House in York, and give notice to the electors of the county, and give them notice that on TUESDAY, the 4th day of November, next, there shall be held at the several election districts established by law in said county, general elections, and will vote by ballot for the several officers herein named, viz:

TWENTY-SEVEN PERSONS  
To be chosen by the Electors of the County of York,  
for Electors of the United States and Vice President of the United States.

The said election will be throughout the County of York.

as follows:

The election in the election district composed of  
borough of Carlisle and the townships of North Mil-  
ton, South Middleton, Lower Dickinson and  
Frankford, will be held at the Court House in the  
city of Carlisle.

The election in the election district composed of  
the eastern part of Pannaborough township, will be held at  
North School House in Plainfield.

The election in the election district composed of  
ever Spring township, will be held at the public house  
George Day, in Hogewash, said township.

The election in the election district composed of  
Hampden township, will be held at the house occu-  
pyed by Henry Nickerson, in said township.

The election in the election district composed of  
township of Upper Allen, will be held at the pub-  
lic house owned by Wm. Kline or Shepherdson in  
said township.

township of Lower Allen, will be held at the w

The election in the election district composed of Pennsylvania township, will be held at the house now occupied by A. Hunsberger, at the West of the Harrisburg Bridge.

The election in the election district composed of Cumberland, will be held at the house formerly by Wm. H. Bohl, in the borough of New Cumberland.

The election in the election district composed of Berks township, will be held at the house of John Hoover, in the borough of Pottsville.

The election in the election district composed of Monroe township, will be held at the public house of Samuel Alger, in Churchtown, in said township.

The election in the election district composed of Cooper Dickinson township, will be held at the house of John Hoover, in the borough of Pottsville.

The election in the election district composed of  
borough of Newville, and townships of Milford,  
Frankford, Upper West Pennsborough, and that part  
of New Castle township, will be held at the school  
district, will be held at the Brick School House in  
borough of Newville.

The election in the election district composed of  
Hopewell township will be held at the New  
School House, in Newburg, in said township.

The election in the election district, which includes  
the borough of Newburg, and the township of  
borough of Shillingsburg, Shillingsburg township  
that part of Southampton township, not included  
in the election district, will be held at the  
Council House, in Newburg, in said township.

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN**

That every person, except Justices of the Peace  
shall hold any office or appointment of profit or  
trust, shall be liable to be removed from office

Incorporated district, whether a commissioned officer otherwise, a subordinate officer or agent, who is or has been in the service of the State, or of any of the several departments of this State, or of the United States, or of any city or of any Incorporated district, and that any Member of Congress and of the State Legislature, and of the Select or Common Council of any city or of any Incorporated district, who is or has been incapable of holding or exercising at the same time office or appointment of judge, inspector or clerk or elections of this Commonwealth, and that no judge, clerk or elections, or other officer of such election shall be alluded to in this act.

And the said act of Assembly, entitled an act relating to the elections of this Commonwealth, passed 2, 1869, further provides as follows, to wit:

That the Justices and Judges shall meet at places appointed by the Governor, and at the times to which they respectively belong, before nine o'clock in the morning of the Second Tuesday in October

"In case the person who shall have received the one and highest number of votes for inspector shall not attend on the day of the election, then the person shall have received the second highest number of votes at the next preceding election, shall act as inspector in his place. And in case the person who shall have collected the highest number of votes for assessor shall not attend, the person elected judge shall appoint an inspector in his place; and in case the person elected judge shall not attend, then the inspector who received the highest number of votes shall appoint a judge in his place, or if any vacancy shall continue in the office for the space of one hour after the time fixed by law for the opening of the polls, the qualified electors of the township, ward or district for which such vacancy shall have been elected, present at the place of election, elect one of their number to fill such vacancy.

special, or township election, during the whole said election is kept open, for the purpose of giving information to the inspectors and judges when called in relation to the right of any person assessed by tax to vote at such election, or such other matters in due time to the assessment, voters the said inspectors and judges shall have authority to administer the following oath:

"No person shall be permitted to vote at any election as aforesaid, until he takes the white freeman of the State at least one year; and in the election districts where he offers his vote at least ten days immediately preceding such election, and within two years prior to the date of such election, he has been taxed at least ten days before the election. But a citizen of the United States who has previously been a qualified elector of this State, and removed therefrom and returned,

any man have resided in the district to vote there, excepting those who have been admitted to vote there in this State six months: Provided, That white freemen, citizens of the United States, be entitled to one and twenty-two years, who have resided in an election district as aforesaid, shall be entitled to vote although they shall not have paid taxes.

No person shall be permitted to vote whose name is not in the list in the name of the electors furnished by the Commissioners, unless First, he produces a receipt for the payment within two years of a county tax assessed agreeably to the Constitution and give satisfactory evidence, either on his oath or affirmation, or the oath or affirmation of another, that he has paid such a tax, or an influence to produce a receipt and make to the payment thereof. Second, claim of right to voting to be made by a person in the year of twenty-one and twenty-two years, he shall pose on oath or affirmation that he has resided in

state at least once year next to the said application, and shall be signed by the person to whom the same shall be made by this act, and that he doers verily believe, from account given him, that he is of the age aforesaid, such other evidence as is required by this act, with upon the name of the person thus admitted to be shall be inserted in the alphabetical list by the instructor, and the name shall be admitted to vote by writing word "tax," if he shall be admitted to vote by reason of the payment of the said tax, "ac," if he shall be admitted to vote by reason of such age, shall be entered to the clerks, who shall make the like notes on lists of voters kept by them.

"In all cases where the name of the person claimed to vote is found on the list furnished by the Commissioners and assessor, or his right to vote, whether thereon or not, shall be given by any qualified elector, and shall be given to the person claiming to be such person on each of his qualifications, and if the clai-

"to have resided within the State for one year or more; his oath shall be sufficient proof thereof, but he shall make proof by at least one competent witness, who shall be sworn to depose that he has resided in said district for more than ten days next immediately preceding such election, and shall also himself swear his bona fide residence, in pursuance of his lawful claim; it is said district, and that I do not remove said district for the purpose of voting therein.

"Every person qualified as aforesaid, and who makes due proof, if required, of the evidence and qualifications of taxes as aforesaid, shall be admitted to vote the township, ward or district in which he shall reside."

"If any person shall prevent or attempt to prevent any officer of any election under this act from holding such election, or use or threaten any violence to such officer, or shall interrupt or obstruct the same, he shall be liable to imprisonment in his county jail for six months."

up the window, or avenue to any window where the same may be holding, or shall riotously disturb the same, or shall assault any person, or shall do any other thing, or shall be violent with design to obstruct the duty of any such elector, or to prevent him from voting, or to restrain the freedom of choice, such person on conviction shall be fined in any sum not exceeding five hundred dollars, and imprisoned for any time less than three nor more than twelve months, and shall be shown to Court, where the trial of such offence shall be held, the place where the offence was committed, and the person who was the resident of the city, ward, district, or township in which the offence was committed, and not entitled to vote thereon, then on conviction he shall be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than one hundred nor more than one thousand dollars, and be imprisoned not less than six months nor more than two years.

monwealth, or shall offer to make any such bet or wager, either by verbal proclamation thereof, or by written or printed advertisement, challenge or otherwise, any person to make such bet or wager, upon conviction thereof shall be liable to pay three times the amount so bet or to be bet.

"If any person not by law qualified, shall fraudulently vote at any election of this Commonwealth, being otherwise qualified shall vote out of his proper district; or if any person knowing the want of such qualifications, shall aid or procure the same, he shall be liable to pay a fine of not more than one hundred dollars, nor less than fifty dollars, on conviction he shall be fined any sum not exceeding two hundred dollars, and imprisoned for any term not exceeding three months.

"If any person shall vote at more than one election, or otherwise fraudulently vote more than once on the same day, or shall fraudulently bid and deliver his vote, or shall vote at more than one election, or shall vote, or shall urge, or shall receive, or shall

or they offending, shall on conviction be fined to five  
sum not less than fifty nor more than five hundred  
dollars, and be imprisoned for any term not less than  
three nor more than twelve months.  
The following shall be considered as offenses in this Code  
withal, agreeably to law, (except the sons of qualified  
citizens, shall appear at any place of election for  
purpose of influencing the citizens qualified to vote,  
he shall on conviction forfeit and pay any sum not  
exceeding one hundred dollars for every such offense,  
be imprisoned for any term not exceeding three months,  
and be forever disqualified from holding any office of  
the said nor every General and Special Election shall  
be opened between the hours of eight and ten in  
forenoon, and shall continue, without interruption  
adjournment until seven o'clock in the evening, with  
the polls shall be closed.  
And the Judges of the respective districts above  
mentioned shall be sworn to and to meet at the Court House
