Lime and lard are the best application to old, and bad sores, of any kind, that I know, especially if the bone is affected. Take good stone lime, slake dry and sift through a fine seive. - Put the flour in a bottle, cork tight, and keep in a dark place from light and air, and it will keep good for years. Take one part of lime to three parts of lard, in bulk, and mix well, cold, and apply a proper quantity to the sore, twice a day, and cleanse well each time with soap suds. If the sore descends below the outward opening, it must be opened to the bottom or - it will not heal sound. If the bone be affected, the sore probably will not heal and ought not to till the bone shall be healed under this treatment always heal sound. If fungus be in the sere, this ointment will clear it all out; and keep it out.
