In China, even this practice is exceeded, not only in extent but in the admirable economy of minute' details. Anderson, the traveller, says :

""On a high monntain I discovered several distint patches of cultivated ground in a state of declivity, such as ap-peared altogether inaccessible, till 1 saw the owner employed on one of them. He had a rope fixed about his middle, which was secured at the other end, on the top of the mountain ; and by this means the hardy cultivator was onabled to let himself down to any part of the precipice, where a few square yards of ground gave him encouragement to plant his vegetables or his corn ; and in this manuer he had decorated the mountain with a variety of cultivated spots. Near the bottom, he had erected a wooden hut, surrounded with a small piece of cultivated ground, planted with cabbages, where he support-ed, by means of this hazardous industry, is wife and several children."

The well known industry of the Chinese enables them to overcome many ob-stacles which, were they to occur in the path of the American or English farmer, would be deemed insuperable. Their whole life is a life of labor, and their labor is regulated by system which renders it not only pleasant, but abundantly productive .- America could at this time; with her present occupied boundaries, support five times her present population without half tasking the capabilities of her soil ; and yet many are fain to complain that the latter is irremediably exhausted and run out. An Irish, Germ: n or Chinese tiller, would no doubt support himself and family, and, not only this, but in a short time become wealthy, on a farm where an American would starve. In their case we behold philosophy teaching by experiment, and the lesson should by no means be lost on us. It should excite and stimulate us to new and more judicious exertions; and firmer reliance on self, and the soil will till.


