PEA BRUSH AND BEAN-POLES. While we are getting the best kind of Peas from the seed store, we may as well be thinking of the brush to stick them with, which are best provided now before the leaves appear. Some grow Peas without this support, but we think there is no substitute for brush to grow clean, handsome Peas. Where they are left to fall, the under side looses the sunlight,

and the pods do not mature as well, besides being soiled by the earth. With good brush, the vines stand erect, and they are much more conveniently picked. When the Peas are ready for sticking, in many other matters will be pressing, and the brush, too will be in leaf, and if used in that condition will cast a shade upon the vines. Now is the time to secure them.

Poles also, should be provided now for the Lima beans, if they are not already on hand. Nothing is quite caqual to young cedars for this purpose. Select saplings ten or twelve feet high and remove about three feet of the top cutting the limbs a little distance from the body, to make supports for the vines. Afte the bottoms are sharpened for sticking, it is a good plan to char them in the fire aud apply gas tar to the ends as far as they go into the ground. The charring alone is a great safeguard 'against decay. Poles prepared in this way, if housed after use in the fall will last a dozen years. This is much better than cutting white birches and alders every Spring for bean


