As nothing conduces so much to the beauty of a farm, as a well set hedge, we invite the attention of our farmers, to the following article on that subject.

HEDGES

People are begining to find out that woodland "dont pay," when it can be converted into cultivated fields, hence, there are many farmers in the country, that are entirely cleared; it would be well therefore, if farmers would turn their. attention to the different kinds of thornbest adapted to hedges and thereby beautify their farms by removing the unsightly, old-fashioned worm fences, and repl cing them with thorn hedges, which givesuch an air of freshness to the fields.

It is a matter of some importance also on the score of economy, as a good hed e will last even longer than the fence which the boy spoke of who said, that " locu-t posts and count rails put together, would last forever, for his father had tried it twice"-ED. HERALD.

Siberian Crab .- This is a member of the apple family, and is often planted as a small ornamental tree, desirable both for its flowers and fruit. It is not a thorn. tree exactly, but when pruned its branches become stiff and crabbed, so much so as to furnish a formidable resistance to the attacks of man or beast. It needs, shearing only once in a year, and takes good care of itself the rest of the time.

In the spring the flowers are quite ornamental, and in the fall its fruit is hardly

Honey Locust .- For a farm hedge this will answer a good purpose. The prinrampant, requires frequent pruning and aplashing and, at best, is course and strag gling. For an outside barrier, where ornament is of no account, it is well worthy of trial.

Osage Orange .- Here we have one of the most popular hedge plants in America. It is clothed with glossy and beautiful foliage, it grows as needy as a willow, bears the shears well, and it armed with a regiment of thorns. It does not suffer from attacks of the borer or insects. It has been planted extensive y at t. e West, and in most localities is said to a s zer every purpose of a farm hedge. By many cultivators it is leared that will not prove sufficiently hardy for the Northern States - Above 40 deg., or 41 deg., north latitude, it is badly cut downin winter. Boing a Wative of Arken a , this is not to be wordered at. () a the other hand, it is contended that it the sod is well drained the plant will prove hardy enough as far north as Vermont What if the tops are a little frost-bitten, it does no harm, and only saves so much labor in the spring pruning. Jrck
Frost works for nothing. Its friends
are enthusiastic in its praise, declaring
that if well trianned, it grows harder every year, and that wherever the Isabella grape or the peach ripens it will make the best hedge in the world; it is unrivalled in the density and stubornes; of its branches and thorns; the smallest bird cannot fly through it; horses, mules, cows, sheep, and unruly boys who wish own side of it. Our own opinion is-thatit will prove a good hedge-plant for the Middle and Western States, but it cannot be relied upon for northern latitudes.

Time of Cutting Grain.

Grain cut from seven to ten days before it becomes dead-ripe yields more bushels to the acre, better flour and is intrinsically worth more money than i. cut when dead-ripe. Besides which advantages there is searcely any oss from shattering, while the straw, as

provender, is infinitely superior. There is another powerful reason in faver of early cutting. The rust, that fell destriver of the wheat crop—that blight upon well-grounded hopes -it is known mak s its appearance on y a few days the grain becomes thoroughy ripeneditherefore, by anticipating this periodby cutting before its appearance—we avert its infliction, for a sore infliction the rust always proves to be. Ag in by outting some days before the period when the grain becomes dead-ripe, more time is allowed for the harvest-a matter of much importance.

To show the advantages resulting from early cutting in England we will give one of several experiments made by Mr. John Hannan, the distinguished English farmer. These experiments extended through five different periods of cutting, viz:

No. 1 was cut a month before fully ripe. 2 "8 weeks "
2 "eeks "
4 "2 days "
5 "when ripe. Taking 100 lbs. of the grain, he found it to yield flour as follows:

Flour. Seconds. 75 lbs. 7 lbs. 76 lbs. 7 lbs. 80 lbs. 5 lbs. 77 lbs. 7 lbs. 10 (Us. 14 lbs.) 5 72 lbs. 11 lbs. "It'thus appears, " says Mr. Hannan

"that No. 3, cut 2 weeks before it was fully ripe, is superior to all other varieties, giving more per bushel than No. 5, cut when fully ripe, by 61 lbs. of flour, and a gain of 15 per cent, on the flour of equal measure of grain. 100 lbs. of wheat of No. 2 makes 80 lbs. of flour, while 100 lbs. of No. 5 yields only 72 lbs., showing an average of 8 per cent. in favor of grains cut raw. In grinding it was found that No. 5 ground the worst-worse than No. 1. In No. 5 were a greater quantity of finty particles, which would not pass the bolt, than in any of the others. the bran from No. 5 was coarse and heavy, while




