New Advertisements. RESOLUTION Proposing Amendments to the Constitution of the Commonwealth.

RESOLVED by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvanic in General Assembly met :That the following the constitution of the FIRST AMENDMENT.

There shall be an additional article to said constituos, to be designated as article eleven, as follows: ARTICLE XI. ON PUBLIC PEBTS.

ON PUBLIC "DEBTS."

Secrity I. The state may contract debts, to simply casual deficits or failures in revenues or to med expenses not otherwise provided for: but the aggregate, amount of such debts direct and contingent, whether contracted by within of one or more action of the general assembly, or at different periods of time, shall never exceed seven hundred and fifty thousand deliars, and the money arising from the creation of such debts, shall be applied to the purpose for which it was obtained, or to repry the debts so contracted, and to no other putpose whatever

Section 2. In addition to the above limited power, the state may contract debts to repel lavasion, suppress insurrection, defend the state in var, or, to redeem the-present outstanding indebtedness of the state, but the money arising from the contracting of such debts, shall

Any city containing a samilent number of taxables to entitle it, of a least two representatives, shall have a separator representation assigned it, and shall be divided into convenient districts of continuous verritory, of equal taxable population as near as may be each of which districts shall jete to the representative. At the end of section seven, same artice, insert liese words, "The City of Philadelphia shall be divided into single senatorial districts, of contiguous territory or as-nearly equal in taxable population as hear as may be each of which districts shall jete to the representative."


