Flower and Garden ints.

Scoron Roses .- This class of roses have small leaflets, small twiggy branches, thickly set with small pines, producing undersized, globular-double, and semi-double flowers, sweetly scented, and blooming early. They have a great ten-dency to throw up suckers, which blossom profusely the ensuing season; and on this acount, some growers cut out the old wood annually.-All the Scotch roses 1esemble each other very much in their habit of growth; they are less easy than other members of the same genus, to distinguish, when leafless in-winter, by the aspect of the wood A collection of the different varieties makes, therefore, a nice, even hedge of roses, which only requires looking over once or twice a year to keep it compact and in order. Budded as standards, they make pleasing heads when full in bloom, but require considerable patience to prune, which should be done by thinning out rather than by cutting back.

CHANGING THE COLOR OF FLOWERS -Florists have long wished for the power to change, as they might wish, the colors of their flowers. Some approach has been made toward the accomplishment of this desirable faculty in some few cases, and there is no doubt but that, in time, such discoveries will be made as will, in some measure, invest the florists with this necessary knowledge. By art, the colors and forms of flowers may be changed, and new qualities given to fruit; by the well known expedient of cross impregnation; but in the case of full flowers, which rare ly admit of such manipulation, recourse must be had to other expedients, and which, it is presumed, will sooner or ater be furnished by chemical science. The running of fine double flowers, that is, suddenly returning to t eir whole or original color, has long been the plague and puzzle of florists. Some imagine that the hange is caused by too much or too rich dress-others assert that an over-lean or sandy soil produces the same effect; and it appears clearly proved that in very dry warm summers, such mutations of color take place, even more extensively than in ordinary seasons. It is a very general opinion amongst the cultivators f flowers, that the richer the soil, the deeper will be the tints of the bloom. The color of the hydrangea hortensis can be changed by the qualities of the nould in which it is placed; and the natural color of the common printose is very soon changed to a pink or yellowish brown by being planted in cow dung. PROPERTIES OF A FINE TULIP.—The

flower of a first-rate tulip should be large, and composed of six petals—these proceeding a little Morizontally at first, and then tarning upward-forming almost a perfect cup, with a round bottom, rather widest at the top .- The three exterior petals should be rather larger than the three interior ones, and broader at the base, all of them having perfectly entire edges, free from notch or serrature, and the top of each being broad and well rounded; the ground color of the flower at the bottom of the cup should be clear white or yellow, and the various rich colored stripes, which are the principal or-nament of a fine tulip, should be regular, bold, distinct on the margin terminating in fine broken points, elegantly feathered or pencilled. The centre of each jetal should contain one or more bold blotches or stripes, intermixed with small portions of the original or breeder color, abruptly broken into many irregular obtuse points. Some florists are of the opinion, that the centre stripes or blotches do not contribute to the beauty and elegance of the tulip, unless confined to a narrow stripe exactly down the centre, and that they should be perfectly free from any remains of the original or breeder color; it is certain that such appear very beau tiful and delicate, but the greatest connoisseurs in this flower, unanimously aggree that it denotes superior merit, when the tulip abounds with rich coloring, distributed in a distinct and regular manner throughout the flower, except in the bottom of the cup, which it cannot be disputed, should be a clear brigh white or yellow, free from stain or tinge in order to constitute a perfect flower

A writer in the American Agricultu rist proposes a new remedy for barked trees, which he says he has tried with success and which is certainly very simple and easily practiced. It is to form an artificial bark by pasting, with good boiled flour paste, several thickness of paper around the wounded part. In this way he says he saved a unmber of six year-old apple and pear trees, which had been so bully barked by gouts that he expected them all to die.

During mild weather in winters peach srees may be "shortened in " A hand one-half of lest year's growth should be be removed from young trees, but old trees with long, straggling, thriftless branches, should be cut back more free ly Perhaps by adopting this method there may not be as many penches produced next year as there would be other wire, but the improved size and qualit. of the fruit will amply compensate for the reduction in number and the trees will acquire new vigor. The "shortening" in process should be practiced year

- To PREVENT FOOD BURNING TO THE KETTLE.—There is a difficulty in stew ing fruit making apple souce or sweet meats, as well as cooking apples, pump kins, potatoes, for starch; about its burning and sticking to the kettle. To prevent this difficulty it is suggested by writer in the Homestead, to place clean rye straw in the bottom of the kettle un der the fruit. That used for domestic cooking should be whole straw cut at the joints and divested of husks. It is casily separated from the fruit after, it is cook ed, and will save it from all burner

Good flour may be known by the fol lowing tests : - "It must pack into a bal and not fall into powder when a portion is pressed together in the hunds. . a por ion is thrown against a smooth, per pendicular surface, it must stick in a lun p, or at least not scatter in a fine pow-Ber. When a little of it is wet and kneaded, it should work dry and clustic, not soft and sticky. It should be pure white, without a blush tint. No minute black specks should be found, on a close exam nation. A slight yellow or straw color is nut objectionable."


