The Flower Garden.

As the time for working in the flower garden has now come, a few hints on its management will be appropriate:

1. Clear off all dead stalks of herbaccous plants; trim-and-prune-shrubs-and-roses. Put everything in good order. 2. Manure rose beds with well-rotted manure;_be=ure-that-all-seeds-that-it-may

have contained are decayed, or they will germinate and fill your beds with weeds Thoroughly rotted manure is the only kind fit to be used in the flower garden. Leaf mold from the woods is also excellent as a fertalizer and is a most essential to the p oper cultivation of many species of

3. If you idtend to transplant and remove hardy shrubs, do it immediately; no. time should be lost, especially Spireas, Forsythia &c., as they are now bursting their buds. Hardy roses should also be removed at the present time. The Remontantes or Hybrid-Perpetuals must be cut down to a strong bud; they will flower all the better. Roses that bloom on last year's wood should be pruned with reference to this. The tender sorts especially such as have been kept in a greenhouse, should not be removed to the open nir until the last of May.

4. In selecting perennial herbaceous plants beginded by good taste; better obtain a few choice things than a host of roots with queer names and doubtful reputation. Phloxes, Lilies, Bellflowers and Preconies are all good. Add others according to taste. ?

5. Sow hardy Annuals in a warm border by the middle of April, if the weather is fine. Tender sorts four weeks later. You may secure a succession of blooms sowing seeds of the early blowing sorts nt different periods. Many kinds improve by transplanting; others will searcely survive the change. It is a good plan to have a little plot of nursery ground, from which to supply the places of plants that are done flowering in the garden. You will by this means always keep the garden

6. Weed your beds of bulbous-rooted flowers and take care that your tulips are not destroyed by hail or high winds -Trim your hox edgings, and put the gravel. walks in prime order.

Indian Meal And Corn Bread.

It is said that many more people would cat corn bread if they knew how to cook it. An "experienced housekeeper" furnished us with some good recipes, which we commend to inexperienced housekeepers. A bushel of corn contains -more nutriment than a bushel of wheat.

The latter is not generally considered fit to eat unless ground very fine and bolted. It is a mistake, however. Indian corn treated in the same way is nearly spoiled. It never should be ground fine Let that be remembered. Fine nfeal may be caten when fresh ground, but it wil not keep sweet. The broken oil globules become rancid and bitter.

Corn cakes, made of meal and water. with a little salt, mixed into a stiff dough, very thoroughly, and baked on a board before a hot fiire, or in what oven, or in little cakes on a griddle, till entirley done, are very sweet, wholesome bread.

Corn and whent bread is wholesome

and nutritious, and easily 'made-if you know how?-Stir two teacupsful of white meal in a pint of hot water for each loaf free it of lumps, and let it stand twentyfour hours. Boil two or three potatoes, peel and slice, and mash in a pint of water, which thicken with flour till it is stiff batter, and then add half a teacupful of baker's yeast. You will use about onethird as much meal, scalded as above, as you do of flour: knead the meal and venst and sponge and add a little salt with the flour all toget er, and work it well and inold in pans to rise moderately, and then bake, at first in a hot oven. This bread will be moist and more nutritious and more healthy than if it were all flour.

Buckwheat cakes are improved by adding corn meal, prepared in the same way; in about the same proportion as for bread. A little wheat flour may be added to advantage. Don't let your batter over rise and sour, and never use saleratus if it does Corn meal pudding may be made of yellow-meal, stirred into scalded skimmed milk till as thick as gruel, and, when cool add ginger, cinnamon, nutureg, salt and sweetening to suit the taste, and a little fine cut suct and some raisins, or dried

peaches, or more, according to size. You who do not believe anything made of corn meal can be good will please try this recipe for a pudding. - Germantown Telegraph.

враонful saleratus, a little spice. Pork Сакв;—Two and a half cups of molasses, 1 cup of sugar, 1 cup of chopped fut pork, I tenspoonful of saleratus; spice, raisins and currants; flour enough to mix as hard as cream of tartar bread.

FRENCH CAKE .- Four and a half tumblers of flour, 8 tumblers of sugar, onehalf tumbler of butter, I tumbler of mil ; I teaspoonful of cream of tartur, 1 teaspoonful of soda. . Spice, citron and raising added if desired.

To Make Ruta Baga Puddieg.

One and a half pints of pulped ruta baga, 2 spoonsful of wheat flour; four eggs, half pint of milk and one tablespoonful of butter. The pan greased and floured and baked with a quick fire.


