

Homekeepers' Receipts.

SAVORY BISCUITS.—Four eggs, separate the whites from the yolks, beat the whites to a stiff froth, then add the yolks beat both together a long time, then add a pound of sugar, a teaspoonful of lemon juice, a half a pound of flour stirring the whole very hard, with a spoon lay them on white paper in an oblong shape, dusting sugar over them; the green should be rather crisp; they will bake in a few minutes a delicate brown.

COOKIES.—One cup cream, 1 cup sugar, 1 ounce lard; pour to suit. GRANDMOTHER'S CAKE.—Six eggs, 12 tablespoons of lard, 1 teaspoon salt and one cup of sugar. Cut the dough in small pieces, roll thin and cut the centre in narrow strips, leaving the ends whole; fry in hot lard, and if you say they are not good it will be because you don't think them as grandmother did.

A Farmer's Wife, in the Homestead, presents the following:
LOAF CAKE No. 1.—Six pounds flour, four pounds sugar, three pounds butter, three pounds raisins or six pounds other fruit, 13 eggs, and so much warm milk as is necessary, with half the butter and sugar to make it as stiff as biscuit. The remainder of the butter and sugar should be added with the eggs when risen. Half a pint of wine, half a pint of brandy, sugar, spice to you like.

LOAF CAKE No. 2.—Six pounds flour, three pounds sugar, three pounds butter, three eggs, beat the shortening and sugar together one hour. Put the eggs in second time, after it has risen the second time, add nine nutmegs, half a pint of brandy, three pounds raisins, one teaspoonful soda and milk sufficient for wetting, and yeast.

DOUGH CAKE.—Four cups flour, two cups sugar, one cup butter, two cups eggs, teaspoonful pearl ash, raisins. FARMER'S PUDDING.—Pare and slice one quart of sour apples; put them in a kettle with half a pint of warm water. Make a biscuit dough, roll it out with a piece of cloth, and on this lay a plate. Roll half three-quarters of an hour until done. The dough can be made as follows: One teaspoonful saleratus, two teaspoonful cream tartar, one teaspoon cream, (or milk and butter) one quart flour; wet it with milk; salt. Roll slowly that it may not catch to the kettle. This is excellent.

The following additional recipes will doubtless be acceptable:
SCRAMBLED EGGS.—Put a teaspoonful of milk on to boil; put in a piece of butter the size of a walnut; salt and dredge in a little flour; three eggs well beaten and stir them in quickly when it boils; stir till it thickens, not curdled—it is much improved by being turned over buttered toast in a deep dish.

EXCELLENT CLAM CAKES.—Twenty nice clams washed and put over the fire in a pot until they open; then take them out and chop them finer add two eggs and thicken the liquor with flour as thick as pancake batter; fry in lard.

YEAST FOR CAKES OR BREAD.—In a quart of boiling water stir sufficient wheat flour to make a smooth thick batter; while hot stir in four ounces white sugar and a teaspoonful of salt. When cold, put in sufficient yeast (say near a teaspoonful) to cause the mass to ferment. Lay it in a covered jar for use. Half a teaspoonful is enough to make two large loaves. To renew the yeast when used up reserve a teaspoonful. This recipe will keep for a long time, and has never been seen. It is simple and efficient for raising buckwheat cakes and bread very light and very white if the flour is good.

GINGER BREAD WITHOUT SALERATUS.—One pound of sugar, one pound of butter, three pounds of flour, two tablespoonful of ginger, one gill of cream; one pint of molasses. Rub the butter in the flour, add the other ingredients. Roll out the dough, cut into cakes, place them on a hot grate over a moderately cool oven. Wash the cakes over with molasses and water before you bake them.

ANOTHER.—Half a pound of sugar, half a pound of butter, one pound and a half of flour, one ounce of ginger, one pint of molasses. Rub the flour and butter well together, add the other ingredients. Roll out the dough, cut it in cakes, place them on a hot grate over a moderately cool oven. Wash the cakes over with molasses and water and bake them in a very moderate oven.
