There should always be at least enough in the truck patch for the use of the family and servants.- Let the crop be managed as the pumpkin, except as to distance of the hills. Six feet each way will be a sufficient distance. Plant both crops by the last of the month. FIELD PEA.

If the seed is the principal object. sow in drills three feet apart and give two or three workings with the cultivator. If you do no mere, plant at least enough in the corn field to insure a full supply for the use of the negroes in winter and spring. For this purpose the common black-eyed or the lady pea is best, For land improvement or hog feeding the black or the clay-pea. The clay-pea does not shed when ripe, and affords a longer time for gathering —Use plaster on this crop by all means soon after it gets above the ground.

## MILLET.

Millet makes an admirable provender for horses or other stock. It will yield twice as much to the acre as the best. timothy, and the crop is fit for the scythe. in less than three months from the time of sowing. A free loam is the best soil for it. The ground should be nicely prepared by harrowing and rolling and well manured. So vigorous and heavy at growth is of course exausting, and it should not be sown without a liberal supply of manure Any-good compost, three hundred weight of guano, or good superphosphate, or fifty bushels of ashes per acre is a good-dressing. Sow by the last of the month or early in. June half bushel of seed per acros testa (Berett SUGAR MILLET AND BROAD CAST CORN.

These should be sown this month by those who want green foud for cows or other stock in August and September; they are heavy feeders and must be well manured.

SHEEP-SHEARING.

Sheep shearing should be done in any warm weather after the 20th of the month. The fleece becomes very oppressive and liable to waste after that time. . In case of a cold rain immediately after shearing put them\_under\_cover. See that the work is done tenderly and carefully.---American Farmer.
