SCISSORINGS AND SCRIBBLINGS.

For the last few weeks the mechanical and other business of the office, has demanded so much of our attention, that we had but little time to prepare editorial matter. However, the loss to our readers is not a very serious one, and we will endeavor to supply the deficiency by selected news items, believing they will more than compensate for the absence of original matter.

POLITICS.—We learn from Washington that a bill for the suppression of polygamy in Utah and other Territories, will be introduced at an early day in Congress, and be vigorously pressed. So it should be. It is rather unfair that one man in Utah should have thirty wives, while the President of this great nation has none!

SUPPRESSING LOTTERIES.—The House of Representatives of Georgia have unanimously passed a bill repealing all laws which authorized lotteries in that State, and prescribing certain penalties for all schemes and sale of tickets after the 1st of June, 1860. We think our authorities should exert themselves for the suppression of the illegal lotteries and kindred systems of gambling. They are clearly unlawful, and have a most pernicious effect upon the morals of the people, particularly of the rising generation. We say, destroy them, root and branch.

RIGHT OF SEARCH.—The ink is scarcely dry on the paper on which the President announced that Great Britain had abandoned the right of search, when a steamer with California passengers is boarded and searched at San Juan del Nicaragua, under the nose of the American Commodore! This is the English paper over again—applied to the United States!

MISSISSIPPI STRAITS.—The total value of steamers afloat on the Mississippi and its tributaries is more than \$50,000,000. They number as many as fifteen hundred—more than twice the steamboat tonnage of England, and equal to that of all other parts of the world. Great country this!

THE RAFTING COMMERCIAL.—The Clearfield (Pa.) Republican says, the soft weather and the rain the latter part of last week, by melting the snow, caused quite a freshet, and a number of rafts went by that place upon it. How far they will get before they freeze up, their crews will probably be able to tell when they return.

DIVORCES.—In the Cincinnati Common Pleas there are just now no fewer than one hundred and seventy-five applications for divorce on the docket, and "the cry is still they come." The divorce laws of Ohio, like those of some other of the Western States, are a positive nuisance, and need to be repealed.

HO CHOLERA IN YORK COUNTY, PA.—The Wrightsville Star understands that the Hog Cholera has made its appearance, and is spreading some ravages in that vicinity. Within the past two weeks several of the Hellam township farmers being afflicted to some extent. Mr. Jacob Strickler, it is learned, lost sixteen head, and the Messrs Roth lost eight head. Mr. D. Kaufman also lost several fattened ones. He has not heard of any further losses, it says, and believe it has now disappeared.

DEBTS.—Bills have been introduced into the Georgia and Mississippi Legislatures, to remove all free colored persons from those States by a certain date, or else then sell them into slavery. Such arbitrary and unjust laws only tend to make slavery more odious and unpopular. Also for the sons and daughters of Ham! where shall they go to?

THE THRUWAY ROUTE THE QUICKEST.—The Tehuantepec route is now the shortest and quickest to California. The passengers by the last trip came from San Francisco to New Orleans in eighteen days, the shortest time that the communication from one city to the other was ever made in. The mails now reach San Francisco in the same time, and but for a three days' detention at Annapolis would have made it fifteen days.

LAKE PIKATER.—A small schooner, about 30 tons burthen, has been recently wrecked at the mouth of Michigan, and several persons, alleged to be connected with the vessel, have been arrested on suspicion of being engaged in a general system of piracy along the shores of the lakes. A quantity of goods found on board evidence of having been stolen, and a large number of skeleton keys, padlocks, &c. were in the vessel, together with a bundle of letters, which, it is said, conclusively prove the existence of an organized gang of thieves, and pirates along the shore of Lake Erie, if it extends no further.

THE MAGNITUDE OF A MILLION.—The human mind has but a faint idea of the magnitude of the sum total included in the term million. As an illustration, it may be stated, that if a man should reach the extreme age of one hundred years, he would not have lived for a million hours, the number falling short one hundred and twenty-five thousand of that amount.

THE OLD NEW YORK EVENING POST.—John Probst, an old man, living in Cumberland Md., has just been discovered to be the rightful owner of a large tract of mineral land in the heart of the richest mineral region in Pennsylvania, worth \$8,000,000. He has sold out his right and title for \$2,000,000.

THE GREAT CALIFORNIA MAIL ROUTE.—The Great California Mail Route, via St. Louis, is becoming popular. Passengers arrived at St. Louis report that upwards of one hundred applications were made for passage eastward at the last trip, and premiums of \$100 were offered for seats. The news by this arrival is not important. Large yields at the Ohio mines are reported, and emigrants were flocking in from all quarters.

CORRUPTION.—The appointment of J. Glancy Jones as Minister to Austria, has been confirmed by the Senate. The vote stood 37 to 14. Mr. Jones will sail from New York, in January.

AN AUGER ASSOCIATION.—Similar to that recently inaugurated in New York, will probably be organized at Harrisburg, in time to make the first parade on Christmas. Each man carries an auger, and a calligraph hand accompanies the procession. The exercises consist in walking to a target and boring a hole through it. Not one man in twenty can do it, and the blunders that are made cause a great deal of sport. Let us have the "Auger Association," by all means.—Harrisburg Telegraph.

Another "Auger Association," at Harrisburg will be entirely useless. There is already an extensive auger association, composed of men from various parts of the State, which meets at Harrisburg every winter. The members instead of walking to a target and boring a hole through it, walk straight to the Capitol and bore bills through the Legislature. They generally do business with a big auger, and are said to drill as well as any boring association in the Union. If another is formed, we fear the members of the Legislature will become as full of holes as a sieve.

THE NORTH AMERICAN.—The proprietors of this valuable paper, have given an example of industry and enterprise, that has probably never been equaled anywhere, either in the old world or the new. On Tuesday morning after the meeting of Congress, they published in addition to their regular issue, a supplement containing the President's message. STATE FINANCES.—The publication of the receipts and expenditures of the State Treasury for the fiscal year ending Nov. 30th 1858 presents the gratifying fact of an available balance in the Treasury of \$892,027.76.

The actual receipts over expenditures for the year is \$308,921.21.—The expenditures includes the item of \$421,377.68 of loans and relief notes, redeemed and cancelled, which is so much of the State debt paid. A comparison of the receipts and expenditures of the year just closed with years preceding, shows the following results:

REMOVED.—The State Superintendent of common schools, Mr. Hickok, has recently removed Mr. Kresson, the county Superintendent of Schuylkill, for neglect of duty and incompetency. Mr. Kresson had been supplied with this county, and failing to obtain an explanation from Mr. Hickok, has applied to the Court of Common Pleas of Schuylkill county for a writ of quo warrant against his successor. This will lead to an investigation of the whole affair, and being the first case of the kind, will excite some interest.

DAY MARKETS.—The city of Philadelphia has passed an ordinance establishing market days. Doubtless the citizens of Lancaster will find this quite an improvement over the old system. The law goes into effect on the first day of January, the market commencing at 9 o'clock in the morning, and continuing until 2 o'clock in the afternoon.

When will the people of this county take this step in the way of progress? This thing of having to get up two hours before daylight and buy a pound of butter, or a couple of pounds of beefsteak, is no joke, either in summer or winter.

RETURN OF THE NIAGARA.—The U. States steam frigate Niagara arrived at New York on Saturday, from the African coast, on her return from the delivery of the captured negroes of the slave schooner Echo. Seventy-one of the negroes died on board the frigate, on the passage out, and the remainder, two hundred 11 number, were landed safely, and provided with clothing, stores, &c.
