## Family Receipts.

A lady in the Germantown Telegraph says she has copied some of the following receipts from other journals, and some are of her own household, and all have been found excellent:

TO MAKE INDIAN QUEEN CAKE .----One cup fat, one cup sour milk, one cup corn meal, one cup of shorts, one cup potatoes, (mashed through a fine wire seive,) one cup white flour, one cup white sugar. one egg, teaspoonful of soil, teaspoonful salt, half a nutureg, balf of one lewon peel (grated fine.) Pour in a buttered tin; baste with the white of an egg over the top; bake half an hour in a hot oven; over over with crushed sugar. Eat hot for tea.

BROWN NUTS .- Take one and a half teacupfulls sugar, four teacupfulls butter-milk, two teaspoonfulls saleratus, two eggs, a little salt, and flour enough to form a dough. Beat the eggs light and mix them with the milk, add the saleratus, turn this into the flour, then add the su gar, and knead well. Roll out to one-half inch thick, cut into little round cakes about an inch in diameter, put them into a pan of hot lard, and then take them out when a nut brown color.

GIPSY CAKE.-One cup fat of fowls two cups white flour, one cup shorts, one oup sour milk, one egg, one cup brown su-gar, one cup mashed potatoes, half an ounce ground grape seed, six drops cin-namon, teaspoonful soda, teacupful salt. Mix well; bake in buttered tins in a how oven, half an hour; baste the top with the yolk of an egg, laid with white sugar.

LEMON PIES .- Beat with the yolks of four eggs, two tablespoonifulls of melted butter. four of white sugar, the juice and grated rind of two lemons.-Put into a froth, adding two tablespoonfulls of grated sugar. Spread on the pies when done put them in the oven and bake again for three minutes. This is for two pics.

TEA FLIPS .- Two cups of corn meal one cup of flour, one egg, one cup of the fat of fowls, two cups sour milk, one teaspoonful of soda, half a spoonful of salt, half a spoonfal of ground cake seed, (pine apple or lemon is very nice.) Mix to a light foam; bake on a griddle: eat hot, with honey or maple molassos.
