Agricultural Department. Distribution of Seed.

The commissioner of patents publishes the following extract from his furthcoming agricultural report, explaining the reason why the distribution of various kinds of domestic seeds which have heretofore beer sent out from the patent office is dispensed with during the present fiscal year.

Owing to the reduced appropriation made by Congress for agricultural purposes for the fiscal year coding Jame 30, 1800, the office has been compelled to reduce its exposes, and confine its action to a more limited sphere than heretofore. In doing this it was found necessary either to decline purchasing for distribution the usual varieties of garden and field seeds, or to abandon the experiment of propagat ing the tea and various other foreign plants and grape-cuttings for which orders had been given. The expenses which had already been incurred in their progurement would hardly justify the office in throwing them aside. It was, accordingly, deemed advisable to apply the remainder of the funds solely to the procuring of information and preparing the material for the agricultural report, and to the propagation and distribution of such varieties of foreign seeds and cuttings as had been, already engaged. These were of such a nature that if they had been distributed throughout the country immediately upon their receipt, the probability is that very lew of them would have reached their destintion in a fit state for propagation. The seeds, more particularly, arrived in such a condition that it was of the utmost importance to plant them at once. For this purpose large propagating houses were erected upon the government grounds north of the canal, between Four-and-ahalf and Sixth streets. These structures now answer well the purpose for which they were intended; as is exhibited by the fact that we have ready for distribution over 30,000 well-rooted tea plants; 12,000 foreign and domestic grape-vine-; 90! rooted seedless pomegranate cuttings, and various foreign, medicinal and ornamental plants. These will be ready for distribution during the present winter and the ensuing spring. ~

Points of Cows.

A. L. Fish, a well known dairyman of Herkimer county, New York, gives in the Little Falls Record some good remarks on the points of cows. He very properly considers strength of constitution and capacity to cat what is offered her at all seasons of the year as of the first impor-tance. He rightly observes also that the indications of such a constitution are a thick mellow skin with soft hair, a bright full eye, a broad loin and hips, deep body and straight back.

('heese dairymen (and city milkmen) usually select cows that yield the largest amount of milk because they depend more upon the quantity of cheese than its quality, and milk is known to make a good yield of cheese that would make but little butter, and poor at that. But I am not in favor of selecting cows that yield the most milk per day or per season, in arriving at a proper standard of excellence for the best ** * The quantity of milk a cow, will give is indicated by the hair and skin and yellow color of the skin inside of the cars and other parts not thickly covered with hair. I have never known a cow with soft hair, and mellow skin, appearing yellow at the roots of the hair when parted with the hands, that was not a good butter cow, and when fattened would mix tallow well with flesh. Having been accustomed to fatten my cows that failed for dairy purposes by age or otherwise, for many years, and being on the lookout for causes of known results, I have observed that those known to give good milk made most thrift in tallow when fattened Hence the conclusion, that cows handling well in what the butchers call tallow joints, may be judged to give rich milk, the quantity to be judged by a marked design of nature in her physical structure Instead of heavy horns, head, neck and shoulders and comparatively light hind quarters, which is characteristic of the opposite sex, sho should show an opposite design by a feminine countenance, a light head, neckand shoulders, widening back from her chest to the loin and hind quarters, where the most strength is required.

Horse-Radish.

Growing horse-radish is gener lly equsidered a matter of very little consequence in regard to the manner of cultivation; and the result is, in most cases, small roots which are inferior in flavor are raised

It is very easy to grow this plant with roots as large as a man's wrist. Select a rich, warm piece of ground full exposed to the rays of the sun, and early in the season dig it deep; mark it off for rows three feet apart, and haul the earth out of the rows so as to receive a heavy manu-. ring; then cover the manure with the dirt taken from the rows, and, set the roots about eight inches apart and keep them free of weeds as you would every other grop and the result will be a growth of horseradish that is worth growing.
