Very few know exactly what the mule is; to say the mule is hybrid between the horse and the ass would appear to be so absolute a truism, that the recipients of the information would be very apt to laugh at the infomant; yet few, compara-tively speaking, know which is the mule -much less that there are two distinct an imals, both the offsprng of the horse and ass, one of which is, and the other is not, the mule.

The offspring of the male ass and the female horse is the mule proper, or in Latin hemionus, or half ass. The offspring of the male horse and the female ass is the hinny or in Latin hinnus, a word which conveys, as also does the former one, a 2.12 distinct meaning which is lost by its trans lation into English; for hinnus is derived from hinnire, to neigh, therefore the main distinction is that the mule inherits the voice of its father and brays, while the hinny inherits that of its father and neighs; there are also other distinctions, the him ny has shorter ears, smaller feet and a long straight mane and tail. But this is a digression from the case in hand and to return to it I will quote

the following from the report of an agri-cultural committee of the State Agricultural Society of South Carolina in the year 1824: The annual expense of keeping a horse

is equal to his cost; a horse four years old will seldom bring more than his first cost Two mules can be raised with the same expense as one horse and the mule is fit for work sooner than the horse, and if of a good size will perform more work on less food, and if attended to when first put to work his gait may be formed to suit his owner.

Some object to the mule because his feet being smaller will sink farther into soft ground .- Does not the difference in weight counterbalance the difference in the area of the hoofs? .

Those who have had more experience in this line than myself say the annual expense of shoeing a mule is not more, than one third that of the horse for the same time. His hoof being harder and of much slower growth, the shoe if well put on remains until it is worn out.

To sum up the advantages of mules over horses we have, 1st. They are more easily and cheaply raised than-horses, 2nd. They are maintained after 'beginning work at much less cost than horses; 3d. They are not subject to near all the diseases of the horse, and those to which they are subject are only in a mitigated form, 4th. They at tain to a greater age than the horse and their average working years are nearly double those of a horse, 5th. They are not injured by neglect or injudicious feeldng of hired hands.
